

Behaviour Support and Physical Intervention Policy

1. Purpose

This policy sets out how Liminal Education East Anglia Ltd supports positive behaviour and, where necessary, uses physical intervention safely and appropriately. It aims to promote a safe, respectful, and supportive environment for all pupils and staff.

2. Principles

- All pupils have the right to be treated with dignity and respect.
- Positive behaviour is best supported through relationships, consistency, and proactive strategies.
- Physical intervention will only ever be used as a last resort, in exceptional circumstances, and in line with legal and safeguarding duties.
- Staff will seek to de-escalate situations and avoid confrontation wherever possible.

3. Promoting Positive Behaviour

We encourage positive behaviour by:

- Building strong, respectful relationships with pupils.
- Having clear, consistent expectations.
- Using restorative approaches where appropriate.
- Providing individualised behaviour support plans for pupils who require additional support.

4. When Physical Intervention May Be Used

Physical intervention may only be used when:

- A pupil is at risk of causing significant harm to themselves or others.
- There is a serious risk of damage to property.
- To maintain safety and order in an emergency.

Any intervention must be:

- Proportionate to the risk presented.
- For the shortest possible time.
- Recorded and reported promptly.

5. Authorised Staff

- Only staff who have received appropriate training may use physical intervention techniques.
- Staff are responsible for ensuring their practice is safe, lawful, and child-centred.

6. Recording and Reporting

- Any use of physical intervention must be reported to the Head of Centre on the same day.
- A written record will be kept, including:
 - What led to the incident.
 - What de-escalation strategies were used.
 - The type and duration of intervention.
 - o The outcome, including any injuries.
- Parents/carers and the commissioner (school/LA) will be informed as appropriate.

7. Post-Incident Support

- Pupils and staff involved in incidents will be given the opportunity to discuss what happened and receive support.
- Behaviour support plans will be reviewed to reduce the likelihood of further incidents.

8. Safeguarding Considerations

 Any use of physical intervention that causes injury, distress, or concern will be treated as a safeguarding matter and acted upon in line with the Safeguarding and Child Protection Policy.

9. Policy Review

This policy will be reviewed annually or sooner if required by changes in guidance, legislation, or best practice.
